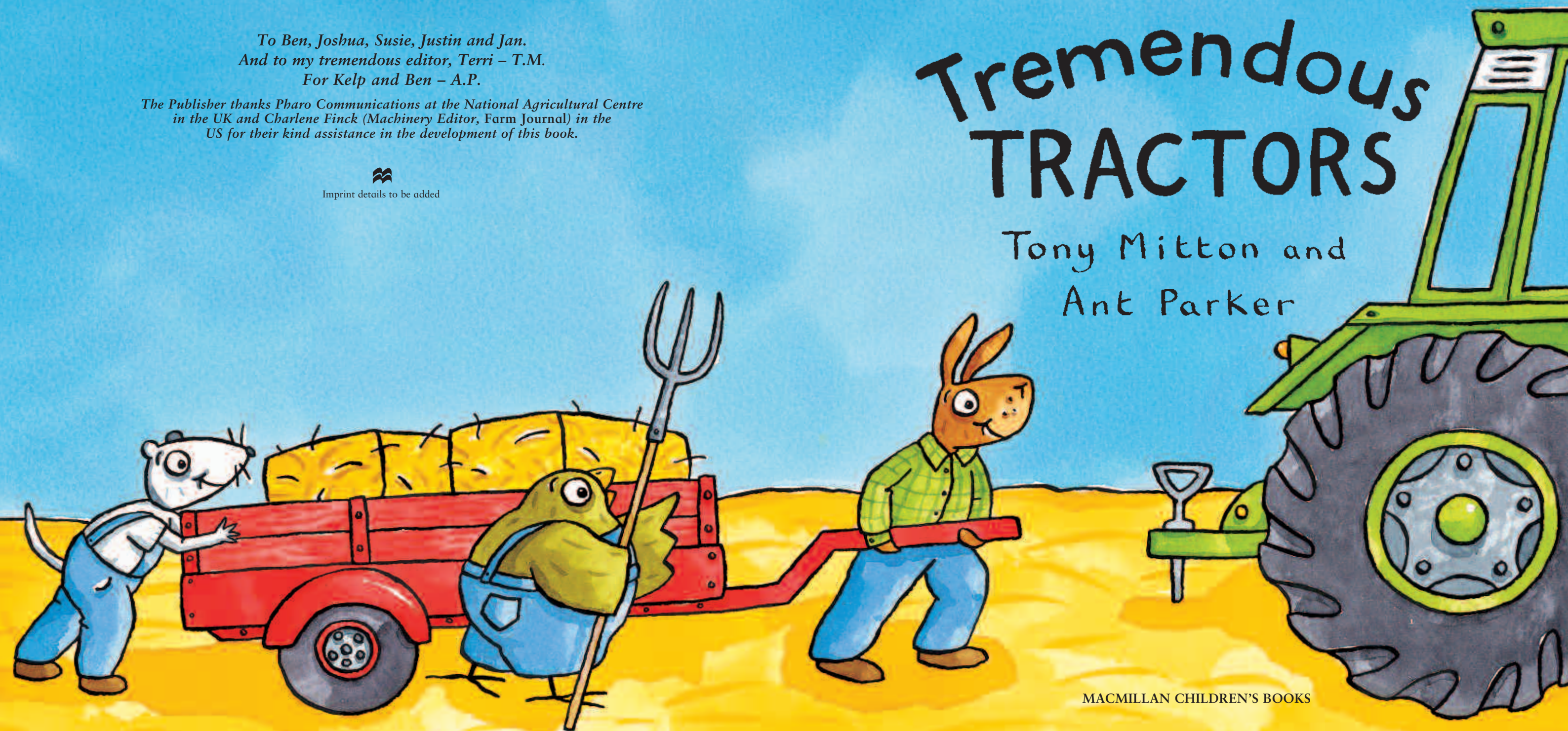

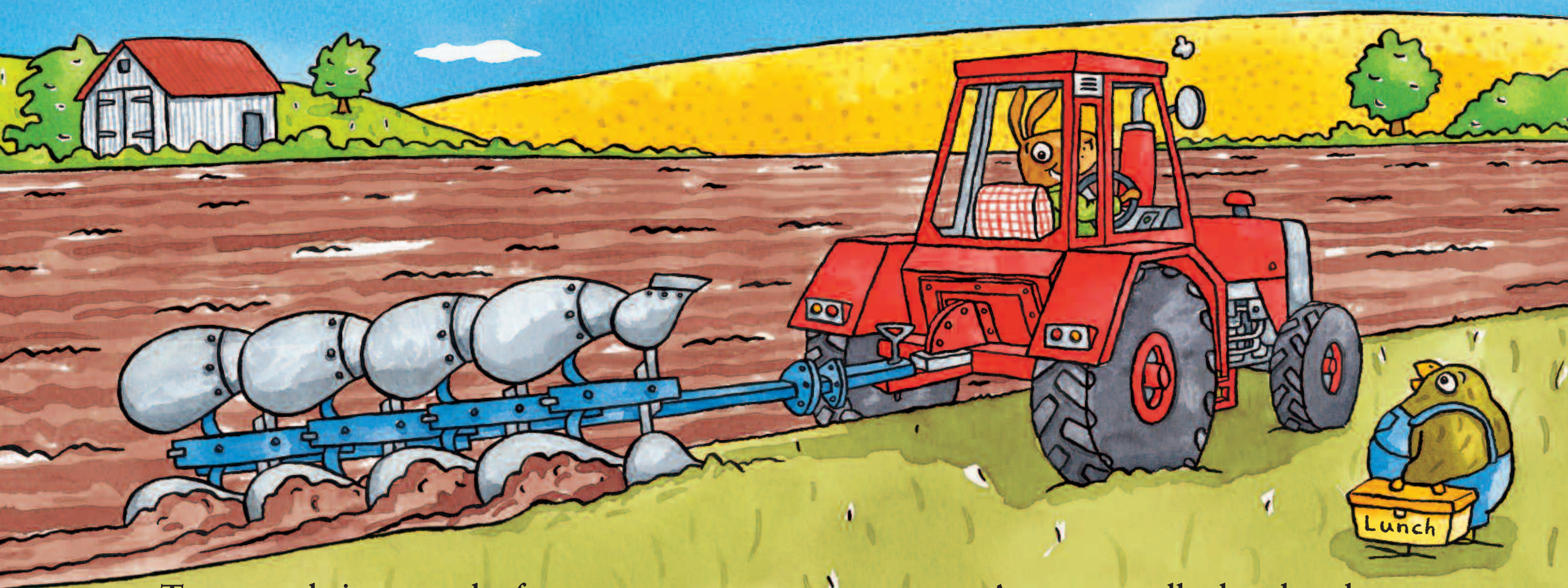
Tremendous, chuggy tractors,

and pulling them along.



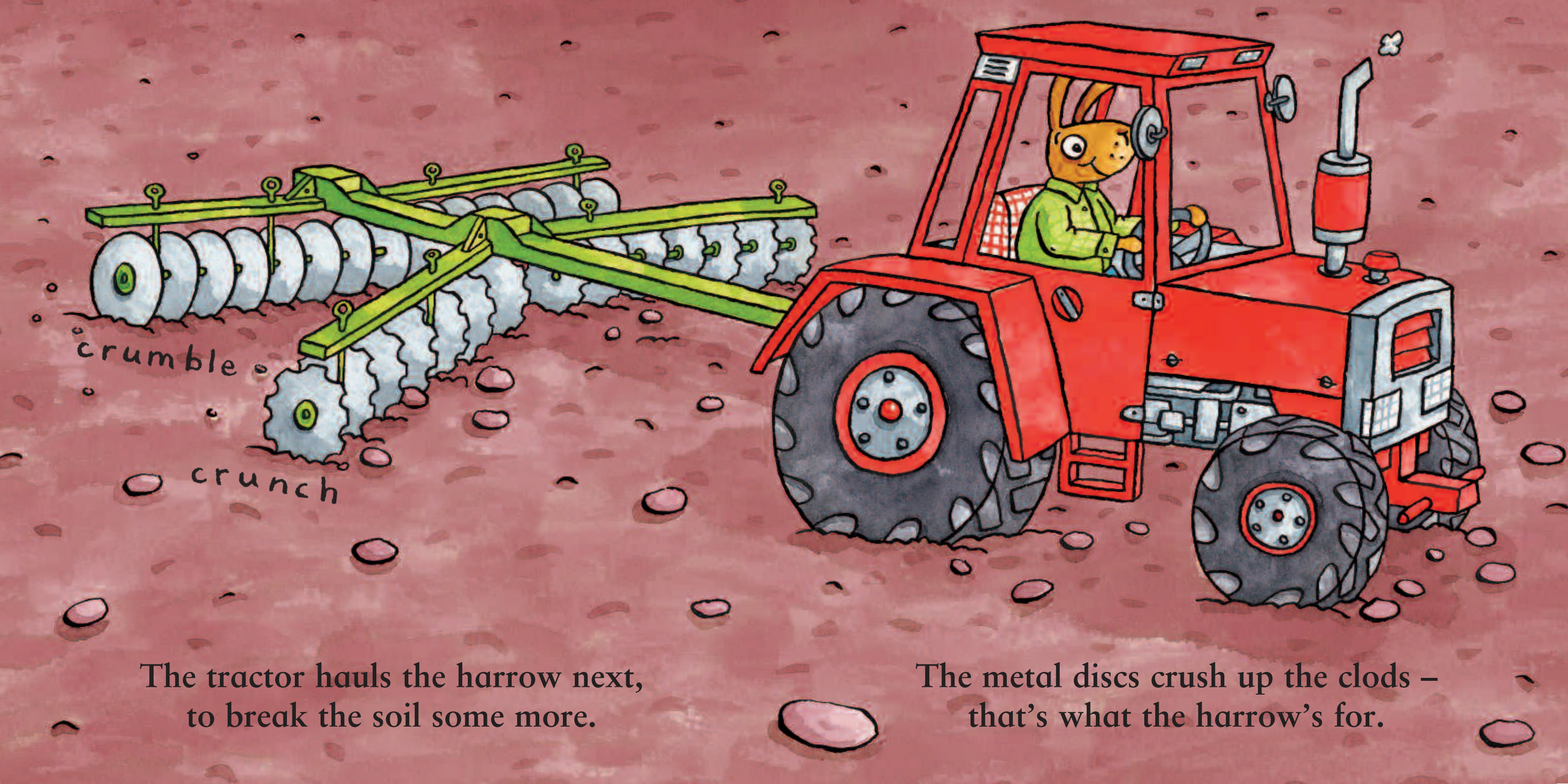
Their big black tyres have solid treads
